

Maximise the Opening

The owners of this property wanted to maximise the size of the opening of the kitchen window.


The solution was a cottage style window complete with a floating mullion. We used a floating mullion window it is purposed designed to house the locking system so a central fixed vertical mullion is not needed between the two opening sashes.

When the windows are fully open, you get the maximum benefit and when the windows are closed, the floating mullion gives the appearance of a fixed frame between the two opening sashes.





Signature 2 Authentic External Astragal Bar

You may decide to have decorative Astragal Bars applied to your windows for the truly authentic Georgian style.

The unique Signature 2 Astragal bar is a scribed PVC-u bar, finished and colour matched to the exact same finish of your chosen windows.

The bars are connected to full length aluminium fixing strips that are bonded to the glass unit. This, combined with the spacer bar grid design inside the unit, gives the impression that each pane is a separate unit.



The innovative Ali-lock bar system ensures the Astragal grille does not shrink, warp or detach, regardless of weather conditions.















Versatility in Design

Internal Georgian Bar

In contrast to the Signature 2 External Astragal Bar system where the bar is applied onto the outer faces of the insulated glass unit, as the name suggests, Internal Georgian Bars are held within the sealed glass unit.

Internal Georgian Bars still provide an effective feature but with the bars inside the glass, the glass maintains a flat surface with no protrusions and are therefore easier to clean.

Smart Safety Solutions

For your safety, easy clean/fire escape hinges are fitted as standard to all side-opening windows. These will open fully to give you an alternative means of fire escape (dependent on window size) and can slide towards the centre to allow easy external cleaning.

Turn the slot-bolts located on the top and bottom hinges 90° and simply slide the window across for easy external cleaning. The window will automatically realign upon closing.

Dummy Casements Provide Equal Sight Lines

The owners of this property have chosen to have opening sashes in the tops of the windows and fixed dummy casements in the lower half. Viewed from the outside all appear to be opening windows and therefore help to maintain a neat, balanced symmetry throughout the property known as equal sight lines.






The below example clearly shows how dummy casements help to achieve equal sight lines. The left image shows opening sashes either side of a fixed pane. The right image also only has opening sashes either side but a dummy casement has been added in the centre to provide equal sight lines and give the impression of three opening sashes.




French/Double Doors

In previous years it was a given that new windows would always be replaced with like-for-like, which in most cases meant white PVC-u.

But in recent years there has been a colour revolution and whilst white PVC-u is still going strong, today there is a myriad of other options available from dark anthracite greys, through to beautiful and elegant creams, all the way through to soft greys and greens.

Regardless of your property style and age our Wodehouse Collection allows you to make a statement with colour on the outside but still maintain a fresh but subtle white woodgrain finish on the inside. French Grey or Agate Grey might work to enhance your property from the outside, but white is incredibly versatile as an interior colour and works well with just about any colour scheme, which will inevitably change over time.

Consider the character of your property – some properties in the UK will be bound by listed building rules that prohibit certain decisions around a property's exterior appearance – while this is unlikely to be the case in many instances, it's



always wise to consider the age and style of your property before you make your final decision.

There are many properties in the UK that would really benefit from the use of these alternative shades to enhance their period features – so don't be afraid to explore this option. 
Glass

Glazing is one of the most important aspects of any window. It can be transparent or opaque, stained or coloured and can even showcase geographical patterns and fashion trends.

Glass can say a lot about a window, which in turn can tell you a lot about the property and its inhabitants. Traditionally, large panes of glass meant wealth, due to the complicated nature of glass production in the 17th Century. Smaller panes were often saved for shop fronts and included bulls eyes, the centre of the spun glass and the cheapest part.

Stained glass and overly complicated Georgian bar designs were similarly a sign of wealth in Victorian Britain and there are examples of this all over the country, but especially in the capital and more salubrious areas.

Aged lead occurs less in sash windows, but is still occasionally seen. Leaded glass often means a lot more weight in the window and can often has a negative impact on thermal efficiency. Glazing itself has had to change with the times and other qualities are now more important to the modern home owner. These include acoustics, thermal efficiency, security and durability, often dictated by ever changing building regulations and planning laws.

Glazing

To enable a conservatory to be used all year round, a glazing material must be selected that deflects heat from the sun in the Summer and retains the warmth from heating appliances in the Winter. Also needed is a material that allows maximum light into your home.

- Our sealed units offer a range of performance attributes perfect for roofs
- All roof units use toughened safety glass: 4mm glass -16mm Argon filled cavity - 4mm glass with black warm edge spacer as standard.
- All roof units are manufactured in specialist roof glass factories and include the Wombourne Windows industry beating warranty for 20 years.
- All glazing specifications are true 'self-cleaning' and offer a range of solar control properties. With a range of colours from our Aqua top of the range, to the blue shade, and clear.

Opening Roof Vents

A roof vent is one of the fastest ways of ventilating a conservatory during the warmest months of the year. Roof vents are thermally broken to ensure optimum thermal performance and boasts a PVC welded frame to eliminate any chance of leaks.

Available on all of the Ultraframe and roofing systems with a choice of manual openers, electronic openers and electric openers with thermostat and rain sensor.





Ground Preparation

- Before the ground floor can be constructed, the ground must be prepared to ensure the slab has consistent support.
- Topsoil and any vegetable matter will be removed from the site. It is easily compressed and may sink, causing the slab to settle and crack up.
- Pre-existing foundations must be appropriately dealt with, and removed.
- All precautions will be taken against ground contaminates, gases, landfill gases, radon, vapours etc.

Foundations

A foundation is required to ensure loads from the building are sustained and safely transmitted to the ground. All load bearing elements.

Foundation Depth

- The foundation trench will be excavated down to consistent and competent virgin ground which will provide adequate bearing strength.
- In chalk soils, foundation depths can be as little 750mm. (This depth of foundation is our standard depth foundation)
- In sand and clay soils, the depth of foundations will be no less than 900mm deep and BS8103 recommends a depth of not less than 1.0m. (This depth of foundation will be used when construction is under LABC)
- In clay soils affected by seasonal moisture, foundations over 2.5m deep are not normally acceptable, in which case piles, raft or pad and beam foundations may be required. (The requirement for a raft foundation may attract additional cost) Additionally, some soils can be affected by particular species of trees and deeper foundations or special foundation types may be required

Hardcore

- To provide suitable material for the floor slab, a layer of clean hardcore at least 150mm thick but no more than 600mm is provided over the prepared oversite ground.
- The fill material used to make up the hardcore will contain nothing larger than about 100mm and be well graded inert fill without hazardous materials. It will contain a range of particles so that it can be firmly compacted, such as clean broken bricks, roof tiles, concrete or crushed stone, or ready-made loose granular material such as 'type 1' hardcore can be used.
- Our fill will be mechanically compacted using a small vibrating plate or roller, in layers no thicker than 225mm so that no air pockets are present and settlement is avoided.
- A layer of a minimum 20mm (but can be up to 50mm) of sand blinding will be provided over the hardcore before laying the concrete or DPM and will be essential to prevent sharp stones from puncturing the sheet DPM.

Drains Near Foundations

- When we dig the trenches for the foundation, all existing services and nearby drains will be supported and protected.
- However, if the drain is no longer in use, it will be removed or opened up and filled with concrete
- The design of the foundations will account for the effect of any nearby drainage trench on the newly excavated foundations. Any service trenches or other excavations will be above the 45 degree line extending down from the bottom of the foundation, as shown below. NB Reference should also be made to NHBC Chapter 5.3 'Drainage Below Ground.


Strip Foundations

- The thickness of a strip foundation will be between 150mm and 500mm. 300mm thickness is used in most of our domestic works.
- Strip foundations are usually at least 600mm wide as
 this tends to be the width of the digger bucket although
 on sand, silt or soft clay, it may be necessary to provide
 foundations as wide as 850mm.

Damp Proof Membrane

To prevent dampness getting through, a ground bearing concrete floor will be used and will be protected by an impervious layer, usually a 1200 gauge (0.3mm) heavy duty polythene damp-proof membrane.


- The DPM will be positioned either on the sand blinding or on the concrete slab.
- Joints in a Polythene DPM will be welted or taped and will overlap by at least 300mm.
- The DPM will be linked with the DPC in the walls, to ensure that the entire interior of the building is protected from moisture by a continuous, impervious barrier.
- The DPM will be dressed up around service entry points.



Walls Below Ground

The concrete foundations will be allowed to cure for at least a couple of days before the external ground walls are constructed to DPC level.

- The walls, usually brick or block-work, will be built up in the centre of the strip foundations At least 150mm projection of the concrete foundation is required at either side of the wall.
- Checks are made that the bricks or blocks are suitable for underground use. The blocks used below the DPC will be specified to comply with BS 5628 part 3.
- The mortar below DPC is for underground use.
- The cavity in the walls below ground will be filled with a
 weak concrete mix (stopped 225mm below horizontal
 DPC in the walls or cavity tray provided), to prevent the
 leaves being pushed together when the trenches are back
 filled.









- As the name suggests, a concrete raft is designed to 'float' on the ground beneath. The structure is made up of an extra-thick floor slab, strengthened by masses on steel reinforcing. Rafts have the advantage of providing the base of a ground floor solution, not just wall trenching, but they are reckoned to be rather more complex to construct.
- A raft is used where the soil requires such a large bearing area.

Costs

When looking at the associated costs with extending your home / living space with an orangery you have to look at the cost of the product as well as the installation costs. Again, this is very much a bespoke consideration as the cost to install will depend on the size of the structure and complexity of install (foundations, existing property features, and integrations).

Other factors that influence the total orangery cost will include:

- Whether you need to go through planning permission
- Building regulations
- Lantern roof size
- The foundation setting
- Integration with your existing property, this can include knocking through walls, RSJ/steel beam supports, and structural calculations
- Plumbing and electrical wiring
- Design process



All of the factors above will impact how much an orangery costs you so it is important to factor these in. Labour costs can tot up guickly.

Whilst an orangery can be an expensive investment, it can also increase the value of your property more than the initial cost, so bear that in mind.

Both orangeries and conservatories can increase the value of your home, but, with the additional structural features that an orangery can bring with a central roof lantern on a flat roof, orangeries can generally add more value to your property.

Orangeries tend to be more expensive than a similarly sized conservatory, but depending on the options chosen for framing and glazing, orangery costs can still be very reasonable. Our structures are of the highest quality, incorporating modern design features such as multi-point locking and adjustable hardware while retaining the clean and traditional aesthetic.



Aluminium vs Timber vs uPVC - Which is Right for Me?

When installing doors or windows, choosing the right material is one of the most important decisions you can make. It will impact the strength, security, longevity of service, and possibly even the value of your property. The three main materials are aluminium, timber and uPVC. Here, we compare these materials to highlight each one's strengths and weaknesses.

Guarantee length	Aluminium can offer long guarantees. Origin offer an industry-leading 20-year guarantee for its doors and windows.	The average guarantee length for timber doors and windows is between 6-10 years.	uPVC guarantee lengths tend to be much shorter than aluminium and timber, approximately 5-10 years.

What is a bi-fold door threshold?

A bi-fold door threshold is the track in which the carriage slides in that allows the door to open and close.

What threshold options are available for the doors?

Wombourne Windows offers two types of threshold:

- Non-weathered threshold this is when the track is almost completely flush to the floor.
- Weathered threshold also known as a 'rebated' threshold, it features a small lip on one edge of the track. The seal on the bottom of the door compresses against the lip to create a weather tight seal.






An Historic Perspective

First introduced in the mid-1600s, the sash window has always been simple in design and yet very elegant. As such it quickly became both fashionable and desirable, a symbol of wealth amongst the rich. Throughout the 18th century aristocrats used sash windows to replace casement windows previously installed in 16th century properties.

Shortly after the Great Fire of London in 1666, it was found that timber signs, oak beams and wooden windows had accelerated the spread of the fire and resulted in the borough of London changing its building regulations. Hence it became a building requirement that window frames be recessed behind the outside brick or stone wall and set back from the front of the building facade, which gave birth to what we now recognise as the 'Georgian' architectural style.

You may be surprised to learn that the benefits of having two sheets of glass closely bonded into a sealed unit was first patented by Mr Thomas Stetson in 1865, making "double glazing" over 150 years old!

Sadly, since the 1960s the indiscriminate replacement of sash windows using mass produced. inappropriate PVC-U casement windows has resulted in thousands of original sash windows being lost, destroying the character and value of many properties in the process.









The sash window however, remains the most efficient ever invented. By opening both the upper and lower sash a few inches, really efficient purge ventilation is achieved, removing stale air quickly and inducing air circulation like no other.

You'll find we're attentive to the finer details too, and totally committed to creating authentic sash windows, with the proportions and elegance of the originals, but with all the attributes demanded by modern living.

Conservation Areas and Article 4 Directives: Retaining character

Any building of importance will be listed to some extent, for its own protection and to safeguard the special character of its neighbourhood. Because so many buildings have had their charm and character destroyed by inappropriate replacements, PVC-U has become associated with inferior casement windows installed in the 1980s. This has led t the widespread rejection of replacements through planning restrictions, regardless of authenticity.

Unfortunately, many officers considering applications still retain these outdated perceptions and refuse applications, without considering the vast improvements made in recent years.

Our installation partners are experienced in dealing with your local planning and conservation departments, and many have been given the green light for projects in conservation areas, because the windows are so good. Do feel free to discuss any worries or concerns with your nearest installer.





What Makes our Sash Windows so Traditional?

To ensure you'll have beautiful windows, we've taken the time to study original sash windows and to recreate the critically important details like these;

- Slim sight-lines through both the upper and lower sashes maximises the visible glass area.
- Equal panes in both sashes creates a balanced appearance consistent with original timber sash windows.
- External staff bead detail on the frame and an option for internal staff bead trims, to conceal the inner workings of the window, just like old sash window boxes.
- Continuous run-through sash horns (not shiny plastic clipons), utilised by the Victorians and designed to place more material below the mortise, therefore strengthening the stile.

- A traditional, butt jointed deep bottom rail (DBR) and bespoke sash sections, ensure the appearance is appropriate, rather than four sections of the same width simply welded together.

Traditionally, scroll handles or cups were fitted on windows internally and D handles under the top sash were fitted externally. Most home owners prefer something visually appealing that can be reached easily from the inside.

Our furniture is colour suited and manufactured by the same UK based hardware company, therefore you will find all the components match and you certainly won't find an assortment of odd colours.

All Bygone windows come with two scroll handles and a single ring pull for the upper sash. Don't worry, we also offer bespoke oak handled poles to reach the ring pull.

Pole Eyes and Scroll Handles

It is customary to have a ring pull or pole eye fitted to the centre of the top rail on the upper sash (a branded pole hook can be supplied if required). Alternatively, a "D-Handle" can be fitted to the underside of the top sash externally, if requested.

Bespoke Locks and Restrictors

When you're investing in new windows, you'll want them to work well and look fabulous forever.

Our design team have looked at hundreds of standard cam catches. These range from thin zinc alloy imports, to chunky industrial locking systems that lack finesse. Having helped write the UK's first security standard for sash windows, we knew the structural loads and requirements needed, but also understood the primary features had to be good looking.

There is now a choice of three distinctive designs and a number of different colour suites. The bespoke Bygone furniture is available in a Beehive, Acorn or Porcelain Ball style and comes in Antique Brass, Chrome, Pewter, Satin Chrome or Black.


We are often asked to make windows with arched heads of varying degrees. Whilst a 'true arch' will have a full semicircular head, a shallow arch or 'swept head' will have a much shallower radius. In the case of 'true arches' the top sash will always need to be fixed and will not slide. Occasionally, our installers are asked to supply windows that are square on the inside, with a swept head on the frame outside. Even these are possible and they're simply known as 'The London sash'.

We appreciate that your home is likely to be your single biggest investment and for this reason we really don't mind you obsessing over the finer details, in fact we encourage it! Please feel free to discuss any unusual shapes or one-off designs with your Bygone installer, they're there to help. 




Wombourne Windows Ltd Full Fascia Replacement


Full replacement involves removing the existing wooden fascia and replacing it with a new PVC fascia board. During this process the felt that guides rainwater into your gutter can also be checked and replaced to ensure your roofing performs properly.

We will remove all of the existing fascia boards, and guttering if you have a cement board soffit we will leave this in as this is part of your fire break, but be assured this does not rot, so we are ok to offer a beautiful hollow cell board in your choice of colour to cap this area. We will repair any damage to the rafter feet to ensure a solid fixing for the new products. An eaves protection system will then be installed where applicable. This is a rigid plastic tray that sits under the first row of tiles and bends down outside the tile to guide rainwater into your new

We will then install new replacement 18mm thick fascia board.
This would include the installation of an over fascia vent system should it be necessary. (This is a linear vent that sits on top of the

guttering.





A thorough job with no shortcuts - ensuring that your roofline will last for years and years to come.









Capping over fascia

You might be tempted to go for a cheaper "patch-up" repair of fascia instead of a full replacement. Known as a "cap over" in the trade, this involves removing the guttering then attaching a PVC fascia "cappit board" to the existing timber fascia. New guttering is then attached to the cappit fascia board. It is essential that the existing timber is sound – if it's rotten it will continue to decay underneath eventually causing the cappit fascia board to fall off.

Capping over is a cheaper roofline repair option as the methods used are less substantial. It should only be considered if the existing timber fascia is in very good condition and free from rot. Attaching a PVC fascia board to rotten timber may cost you more in the long run!
